

Willow Creek 1 Million consecutive hours worked accident free



Linde Process Plants, Tulsa, USA is executing a 450 MMSCFD Cryogenic Gas Plant for Williams Field Services LLC in Rio Blanco County, Colorado. The project name is Willow Creek TXP-1, and has been under construction since May 2008.

On June 26, 2009, a milestone was reached when Linde, our client Williams, and Rust Contractors were recognized for Outstanding Safety Performance, accomplishing 1,000,000 consecutive exposure hours of accident free work.

This accomplishment was realized in spite of the major challenges presented

by building a grass roots plant in the mountains of western Colorado. LPP literally carved the top off a mountain and built a 450MM SCFD Gas Processing Plant with an average of 450 construction workers on site even through the winter months.

The rapid progress of field construction for the Willow Creek TXP-1 job site was a direct result of Linde Process Plants' "Begin with the End in Mind" philosophy; early engagement of a qualified construction contractor at the engineering phase; thinking outside the box by pre-fabricating the foundations over the winter months and selecting the correct

team of professionals to staff our task force and manage this challenging job site. The Willow Creek TXP-2 plant, to be built adjacent to this site, is currently under discussion.
